My 1999 MG K3 Pedal Car A mini-replica of a 1934 MG

By Larry McCartt hildren's pedal cars. including boats, planes and fire engines, too) have been around since the beginning of the full-sized motorized creations in which adults have enjoyed motoring about. Early pedal cars were fashioned here and overseas mainly of wood and small sheet medal where wood was difficult to fashion as in hood tops, seats and the like. Prices of early vehicles were below ten dollars for really nice models. Wire wheels were very common on the early cars. These early cars had brushed-on finishes and for the most part should be left alone even if rust or corrosion is present. Toys should never be "restored." Toys are at their best with a little child- worn patina left here and there. Early vehicles are highly prized today as collectibles and very often fetch much more than their full-sized counterparts as demonstrated by the salon Ferrari in the April issue of Road & Track magazine. The tiny little Ferrari roadster, which is electric powered, is worth more than most full size Ferraris on the road today.

The little MG shown is around 5' in length and weighs about 50 pounds. It has electric headlamps, independent suspension, seating for one child, 4 to 7 years old. The owner's granddaughter, Molly, is just about too tall at 8 years of age.

The K3 was finished in duo-green at

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the request of it's owner and registration plates front and rear have the owner's birth date with the cars initials in front of 2332. It also has a MOT sticker affixed showing the build date and year.

The little car is big hit with pedal car fans from 3 to 80 years young. For more information on pedal cars, log on to Pedal cars web sites; there's plenty of information on the Internet, besides books on the subject in automotive bookstores. The K3 was purchased sight unseen through PedalPower in London, while on holiday in England last Fall. The owner had the good fortune to meet the actual builder, who has models in the Bugatti, Bentley, Alfa and Riley livery. The K3's owner saw a Rolls-Royce model in the London showrooms of Jack Barclay. The Bentley was there also. They sure looked petite along side their fullsized counterparts! 


the downtown streets will be closed off to allow ample parking for all of expected attendees and to facilitate lots of opportunities to meet and greet other persons attending this event.

TECH. TIPS & TRICKS

Prop Rod Problems

any owners of MGB roadsters from 1971 on have trunk lids that are bent or creased. This is caused by the telescopic trunk lid prop fitted to these cars, which replaces the "rod type" props fitted to earlier models. The trunk lids on these cars are very heavy and require more support than the original BL design allows. One can correct this problem by adding a second prop to the right side of the trunk lid. This addition allows the lid's weight to be evenly distributed and keeps the lid from bending. First purchase a second trunk lid prop rod (Moss #457-465). Then, using scrap sheet metal, fashion two brackets to hold the new prop in place. These

new brackets must be

attached carefully to insure

that they are the correct

distance from the edges of

the trunk opening. If this

distance is not the same as on the original prop, only one of the props will latch, causing you to be again using only one prop. These

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
pop rivets, or (for the well-equipped enthusiast) welded on. After attaching the new prop, be sure to grease its track and oil the latches, not only to ease operation but also to prevent rust.

Although the addition of a second prop does make it a little more difficult to close the trunk it does go a long way to extend the life of your MGB's trunk lid.

Easier Engine Removal

When I recently removed the engine of my MGB I discovered that if the rear of the car was jacked up instead of the front, the engine came out and went back in much easier. This was because the engine did not need to be angled as much as when sitting on all four wheels...also I had lots of room to work under the car to attend to the cross-member rear engine support. I pulled the engine and transmission together and used two auto ramps under the rear wheels which gave just the right amount of clearance for removing the engine.
