Hosting NAMGAR GT-37

s we begin a new year and settle into the winter doldrums, I look back to July when the conversation first started. Actually the seed for this notion was planted many years ago. I thought there might be a chance one day but didn't really believe anyone else would be interested. I also did not want to try to do this myself. I need help, and quite a bit of it, to do a good job.

I'm speaking of course of the notion that we host the NAMGAR Get Together in 2012. Lois and I have been attending these annual events since 1989. A number of you also have experienced these annual events and know first-hand of the great fun we have at the GT's. Somehow the conversation was started and of course everyone looked to the Griblers and said - you're in charge.

Since then we have had a number of discussions at both regular and special meetings to get the ball rolling but there still seems to be some hesitation on the part of the group. This is a little puzzling to me - let me explain why.

The goal is to host NAMGAR GT-37. This means we would be responsible for organizing the event. NAMGAR dictated a number of elements involved, including a car show, an awards banquet and any number of activities that we are free to create. We would also be responsible for creating a logo, selecting regalia items, organizing vendors, soliciting door prizes, choosing a host hotel and an array of other responsibilities. Fortunately NAMGAR realizes that this seems like an overwhelming task and thus has produced a guideline to help local clubs with the task.

We have a pretty large club by British car club standards - and ours happens to be all MG (ignoring Ron and Louie of course). Clubs with far fewer members have successfully put on these GT's. We also have a large number of willing volunteers with many varied talents and loads of enthusiasm. Since this discussion started, I've had many members tell me that they are more than willing to help. Just look at the success of BCD and how we've made it better every year! So why the cold feet when it comes to hosting a national MG event?

I suspect that there are two issues weighing in. The two usual suspects are (no surprise here)...time... and money.

For those of you who attended the last GT meeting at the Wolfe's home, you know we went through an exercise where we did a first draft plan of the GT schedule. After we had it all in black and white on the easel I thought it was clear to everyone that the time we would be asking anyone to volunteer for any one stretch would be only a few hours. The way these events are structured there really is no need for everyone to be there all day, every day, as is the case with BCD. Probably the longest stretch will be the car show - with an early morning set-up but over by noon or 1pm. Evening hospitality might be a three hour stretch for someone but it doesn't have to be the same folks every evening (and don't forget that you would be in charge of the tap). We are not alone either as there are NAMGAR staff members and a loyal group of NAMGAR folks that will volunteer to help us if we ask.

The other commodity involved is money. You may have noticed that I have used the word host, and not sponsor. That choice is simply because we are the hosts. There is no requirement on our part to spend a dime of our own club's money to put on this event. We risk nothing financially. The event is fully funded by the attendees with NAMGAR picking up the difference if the registration and activity fees do not cover the cost of the event. NAMGAR also provides the host chapter with start-up money to pay expenses at the early part of the venture before registration funds begin to flow in. Financially the design of the event is to break even. However, NAMGAR will split any residual income with us if there is any. If there is a loss, NAMGAR picks up the difference.

At this moment we have about 2-1/2 years to plan. Details of the event are relatively unimportant at this time, but it is critical to find support within our club and establish the planning committee. The committee chairs have the responsibility for organizing the details and ideas that will make the event both memorable and smooth-running. NAMGAR has provided us with a comprehensive guide that will help

to make this an easy task.

Those of you who aren't interested in being in charge of a committee are urged to volunteer your time to help with the many details in putting on the event. This can be a few hours many weeks the event prior to assembling registration packets and goodie bags, putting together the instructions for a driving tour or buying materials for banquet table decorations: or it could volunteering be two hours one evening of the



event serving drinks and snacks at the hospitality suite, manning a rally checkpoint or serving as a tour guide.

And if you are not interested in participating at all, that's OK, too. This is not a sentence to the gulag, only a request for volunteer support.

At this writing I have volunteers for a few of the committee chairs, a group of willing volunteers to operate the event and 2-1/2 years to work out the details.

I'll see you at the meeting!

Member featured car of the month...

John Barton's '54' MGTF

John Barton

y MGTF was built in October of 1953 and was titled in 1954. It was probably shipped to Europe to a service man since the speedometer registers in Kilometers and is left hand drive. I purchased the car in 1994 from the second or third owner. The car, last driven in 1971, had been stored on jack stands and covered since then. The tires (the original Dunlop "Gold Seal" bias ply, live rubber with no cracks, dry rot or checking) were also covered and on pallets. The canvas top and tonneau cover are also original. The car had been repainted and the paint was so thick it was cracking or checking. Squirrels had made homes in the upholstery and exhaust system.

After adding fluids, I determined that the engine was free. Before I could drive the car home, it was necessary to reinstall the brake shoes, which had been installed backwards. After installing a new battery, the engine started right up, with no leaks or knocks. The rebuilt engine and transmission were OK.

Also, after taking many pre-restoration photographs, the car was stripped. And, many labeled food jars later (for parts, nuts, bolts, etc.); the car was ready for painting piece by piece—(no masking). The paint is a flexible, non-cracking paint.

Every electrical connection in and under the car was polished with fine sand paper "di electric" silicone grease was applied, so I have no problems with flickering lights or amp meter or any Lucas problems. This includes the starter, generator, voltage regulator, etc. The electric clock had to be sent to Great Britain, since no one here had the parts or know how with which to make the repairs. The electric clock must be disconnected during storage to avoid running the battery down.

The entire fuel system was cleaned, carbs rebuilt and the entire brake system had the same treatment. All the rubber was replaced including the fan belt, water pump, hoses and rubber beading between sheet metal parts.

The fact that each piece was prepped and painted separately and reassembled with extreme care to avoid scratching the paint; paid off at professional judging. The car was awarded 98 out of 100 points. The black and yellow factory replacement spark plug wires counted off.

Restoration of my 54 MT TF was a four year project. The car drives quite well with no leaks and is a joy to drive. My riding companion, my dog Molly, loves it as well!



Four and a half years of hard work later, and it sure shows!.
