Proposed Amendment to MGCC By-Laws

Important...Please read.



t the June meeting, the following matter was discussed, raising the possibility of changing the by-laws to allow the treasurer to serve more than one term. Please read carefully and come to the July meeting with any comments you may have.

Motion to Amend the By-Laws regarding the election of the Treasurer, proposed by Skip Peterson, the motion that was made by Bonnie Hankey, seconded by David Johnson, and passed by a majority vote to be tabled for further discussion.

According to the procedure for changing a by-law: publishing this proposed amendment in the Octagon News, both digitally and in printed form, and offering discussion and possible revision of this motion at the regular July club meeting, and then voting on the amendment at the regular August Club meeting. To approve this amendment, $\frac{3}{4}$ of the members present at the meeting must vote yes.

The Motion states to change ARTICLE IV - ELECTIONS

From:

A. Officers shall be chosen by the members at the regular September meeting called for that purpose. They shall hold offices until their successor are elected and installed. New officers shall ordinarily be installed within one month of the election. No officer may succeed himself in the same office, and the President is not for re-election to any office until one year has elapsed.

To:

A. Officers shall be chosen by the members at the regular September meeting called for that purpose. They shall hold offices until their successors are elected and installed. New officers shall ordinarily be installed within one month of the election. No officer may succeed himself in the same office, except for the Treasurer, who may be elected to that position for three consecutive terms. The President is not for eligible for re-election to any office until one year has elapsed.

Pizza Spilled on Little Rock Interstate


rkansas highway officials shut down westbound lanes of a cross-country interstate in Little Rock on August 9 for four hours so crews could pick up pizza.

An 18-wheeler containing DiGiorno and Tombstone frozen pizzas scraped a bridge support and sliced open its trailer Wednesday, spilling them across Interstate 30 in front of the Arkansas Department of Transportation office. Agency spokesman Danny Straessle said the bridge had only cosmetic damage.

I-30 was closed for a time in both directions while crews picked up the DiGiorno and Tombstone brand pies. The highway, which goes around the south side of Little Rock, is part a major link that connects Dallas and points west to Memphis.

Agency spokesman Danny Straessle said the bridge suffered only cosmetic damage. He says "there were some people shaken up" but that no one was hurt.





The westbound section of I-30 was closed for four hours and was closed eastbound for an hour too while crews cleared away the mess. Straessle says the pizza sauce, the cheese and pepperoni, plus some spilled diesel left a "slippery spot."

There was no word on who missed out on pizza deliveries because of the accident. While pizzas are certainly preferable to slimy hagfish when it comes to highway spills, a frozen pie that slowly defrosts in the blazing sun makes its own kind of special mess. Video from the scene shows an endless sea of smashed boxes and pepperoni pizzas, many of which wind up smeared into the pavement as crews brought in large front-loaders to scoop up the bigger piles. It reportedly took workers more than four hours to clean it all up.
