1000 MPH Bloodhound SSC Makes Test Run

A car built to go 1000 mph has completed its first public tests.

The Bloodhound SSC is a jet and rocket-powered streamliner that uses a Formula 1 engine as a fuel pump. The needle-nose car made two runs Newquay Airport in Cornwall, U.K., on Thursday with land speed record holder Andy Green behind the wheel.

Green was the first man to break the sound barrier in a car in 1997,



when he hit 763.035 in the Thrust SSC. This time, he only reached 210 mph, but he got there in just eight seconds. He made two runs to test the Rolls-Royce jet engine and the car's control,

The 1.7-mile runway is not long enough to go much faster, and the record runs are scheduled for the Hakskeen Pan flats in South Africa, where a 12-mile track is being prepared for an attempt at an 800 mph record in 2019 and an all-out assault on 1000 mph in 2020.

Additional test runs are scheduled for Oct. 30 at Newquay. (*editor's note – that's somewhere in England*)

Car (song lyrics) of the Month

He'd Have to Get Under – Get Out and Get Under (to Fix Up His Automobile)

This is one of the lengthier titles in the history of popular songs. The song was published in 1913, with music by Maurice Abrahams and lyrics by Grant Clarke and Edgar Leslie.^[1]

It was introduced in vaudeville by Adele Ritchie,^[2] and was a hit for recording artists such as Al Jolson in 1913, Billy Murray in 1914, and it was revived by Bobby Horton in the Ken Burns documentary film Horatio's Drive (2003).

The title was essentially self-defining. The song poked fun at the trials and tribulations of the average young car owner of the 1910s, especially when he wanted to get down to some serious "sparking" with his female passenger.

Driver Given \$117 Ticket for Singing

Montreal police gave a motorist a \$117 ticket after pulling him over in late September. His alleged crime: Loudly singing the 1990s, um, classic, "Gonna Make You Sweat (Everybody Dance Now)" by C+C Music Factory. It's unclear if the nature of the violation was a matter of volume, repertoire choice, or stylistic interpretation. It appears to be the first thing, but it could've been a clean sweep.

Taoufik Moalia, 38, a father of two, told CBC News Montreal he was motoring along, singing, when he saw flashing lights. And then four(!) Montreal officers approached his car to ask what he was doing. He said, "Nothing." To which he says they replied, "Did you scream loudly?"

"No, I was just listening to my favorite song," Moalla recalled saying. And then here is where he may have hurt his situation: "I repeated, 'Everybody dance now!'" The cops' response was a \$149 (\$117 U.S.)

ticket for "screaming in public." Moalia says he can understand cops stopping him to see what was going on, but he was "really upset" by the fine.

"If they found that everything was OK and there was no danger, they should have told me to continue on my way ... but not a \$149 fine," he said. "I was singing loudly in my car. Is there something that forbids that, or did I really bother anyone?"

He put it in Canadian terms: "Imagine if the [Montreal] Canadiens won a game," Moalla told CTV Montreal. "All the fans are going to scream out of their cars. They're going to sing. Are you going to give them all tickets?" The Montreal police aren't commenting. But apparently, "screaming" is a violation of "peace and tranquillity" with a fine up to \$1,000 for a first offence.

Moalia plans to fight for his right to party, but he might not get a court date for a year. Meanwhile, he has already lost in a higher court. His wife told him, "If it was for singing, I'd have given you a ticket for \$300."
