

MG-X Motion Concept to Preview New SUV in Beijing

That MG storied marque still is exploring new segments in its new home.

The MG of the present is a bit ... unrecognizable, but the company is forging ahead into new segments and new powertrains. A year ago at the China auto show, the company wowed crowds with the MG E-Motion concept, previewing a luxury electric coupe set to enter production in 2020.

Due to break cover at the Beijing auto show in a matter of days will be another new segment entry for MG: The X-Motion concept will preview a large SUV. Slated to enter production later next year, the SUV will share its underpinnings with the Roewe RX8 SUV, which will enter production later this year. And if the MG version ends up sharing engines with its Roewe sibling, this could mean it will receive a turbocharged 2.0-liter four-cylinder producing 221 hp and 266 lb-ft of torque.

Is the world ready for an electric MG?

MG, the former British automaker once known in the U.S. for its affordable sports cars, is not only alive and well, it's reportedly about to introduce something far more advanced than the last ...A production version of the X-Motion concept, previewed in these teaser photos, will certainly go on sale in China, but the bigger question may be whether it will go on sale in Europe. The X-Motion will join the compact ZS SUV, which entered production last year, aiming to become the volume model in the brand's lineup in the U.K.



MG has enjoyed a modest comeback in the U.K. following its sale to a Chinese consortium 12 years ago, but it is by no means a sales leader in the U.K. or elsewhere in Europe. As the Chinese domestic car market overtook all others a few years ago, most of MG and Roewe's growth has occurred in *that* market, and there's still plenty of room to grow -- China is far from having an auto ownership comparable to that of Europe.

\$300,000 McLaren Supercar Found Wrecked in Desert

Police say seatbelts saved the lives of two people who crashed their \$300,000 supercar in the Nevada desert, but the vehicle's engineers deserve a fair share of the credit. The Nevada Highway Patrol found the totaled McLaren 720 about 70 yards off a road near Lake Mead last week, with damage suggesting that it had rolled at least once as it just missed falling down a ravine.

The 710 horsepower coupé is one of the quickest cars in the world, and has a top speed of 212 mph. It features a carbon fiber passenger cell, similar to a racecar's, that's designed to be both lightweight and extremely strong. Despite the massive impact, which left parts of the vehicle scattered around it, at least one of its butterfly-style doors still worked after the accident.

According to police, neither of the occupants was seriously injured. They weren't there when the car was discovered, however. After searching the area, police learned that they had gotten themselves to a nearby hospital to be treated for scrapes and bruises.



The car was apparently taking part in a cross-country exotic car rally, which is a gathering of supercar owners who stay in high-end hotels and hold parties at each stop along the way.

In YouTube video shot at the scene by Daily Driven Exotics, the driver of a Lamborghini Huracan who was taking part in the event says that he spoke to the McLaren passengers and that they were OK.



Terry Looft, "The valve cover with that L vent has an orifice that allows a measured, metered amount of air into the engine. You don't need the hose, but you do need the port on the valve cover."

Lois Gribler, "Does it have to be car related? If you end or use Epipens, ask your doctor about a product called Adrenaclick. It's a lot cheaper than Epipens. Additionally, there's a new Shingles vaccine shot out that's 98% effective."
