ver the last year, our treasurer received numerous requests, appearing to be from our club president, to pay a bill on behalf of the club for which she'd be reimbursed. As newsletter editor, I also received such a request a few months ago. Apparently, the slime-bags scour the internet for club newsletters and websites that list their officers and send such requests. Using spoofing technology, the return address even appears to be from the club president, but any reply will go directly to the schmuck running the scam. *Be warned and don't fall for this*. If you receive such a request, there's about a 99.999999% chance it's bogus, but you can verify via phone call to the officer that appears to have made the request.

Skip Peterson also reports that he read in MG Driver that the NAMGBR has also been the subject of the exact same money scam that they tried on us. Same tactic used, fake vendor, emails looks like it came from a club officer, etc. They indicate that this is going on among car clubs that have a website with links to officers, and have a newsletter that you can access online to see the account balance from previous months.

MGB 2019 Traverse City

e have a bit of information that we would like to share with all of you on the MGB National Meet next year in Traverse City, Michigan. The meet will begin on Sunday, June 23 and continue through Wednesday, June 26. It will be held at The Great Wolf Lodge in Traverse City.

Terry and I drove up to attend the Annual General Meeting at the end of October and were able to tour the facility. It is a grand hotel with approximately 280 rooms on four floors. We were told that the national meet will have roughly 75-80 percent of those rooms. It is a 'kid friendly' hotel that is centered around a gigantic indoor water park.

The hotel will be blocking off two parking areas for our MGs, one on each side of the hotel. The 'car show' area is not on the hotel grounds, but is only an easy five-minute drive away. That will be held on the grounds of an old mental hospital campus which closed years ago. There has been a partial renovation of portions of this hospital which now houses shops and eateries. It looks to be a pretty nice venue for the car show.

Registration is **not** open at this time, but were told that sometime in December the website should be up and running. As in years past, you need to register for the meet before you can get a room reservation.

Our drive to Traverse City took us about eight hours. It is around 450 miles, so it will probably need to be driven in two days.

I can't think of much else to tell you – If we find out more, we'll pass it on. It should be another very nice get-together of MG enthusiasts, so plan on driving along with all of us to Michigan!

British Company to Build Electric MG Roadster

However, these aren't old MGs turned into electric cars -- these are brand new cars.

British company RBW is the latest to jump on the electrification bandwagon and will soon offer an electric MG roadster. RBW has partnered with the British Motor Heritage to build new body shells and recreate the MG roadster as a purely electric vehicle.

The company says it wants to secure the future of driving by creating zero-emission versions of historic sports cars. MG is certainly a good place to start.

Details on the electric powertrain are slim, but the batteries and other running gear will come from Zytek,

a subsidiary of Continental. Zytek most notably provides components for Le Mans racers and Formula E.

It's unclear how much power the electric MG makes or what the estimated range rating is.

From the looks of the roadster, the car retains its popular design — MG sold 520,000 of them — but we sped a few changes. RBW badging is present on the exterior, the headlights are trimmed with LED, and a modern gear selector sits where a manual gear selector would sit in

an original MG. It also appears the roadster gets an updated gauge cluster, perhaps fully digital.

RBW plans to build just 18 roadsters in 2019 and each will cost \$130,800, including applicable taxes. They'll come in right- and left-hand drive and the company is now taking deposits. Those interested will pay \$10,900 up front, but the figure is fully refundable until the customer test drives a production RBW roadster. The first test drivers are scheduled for May 2019.

After the test drive, the customer can then decide whether he or she would like to proceed. If the answer is yes, delivery will take place in summer 2019. RBW also plans to build an electric Jaguar XKSS, so look out for that model in the near future.
