

Honor Flight Car Show in Lebanon

don't recall how I found out about it. Someone sent me a flyer, and I got it too late to announce at the last club meeting, but I couldn't miss this one. As a veteran and having gone on an Honor Flight trip to Washington DC a few years ago, I couldn't pass up the chance to help raise money for this unbelievable program. Yes, I said "unbelievable" because that's exactly what it is.

Honor Flight is a nation-wide program that flies veterans from WWII up through the Vietnam era for a day to see their memorials. There is no charge to the veteran. Everything is included: charter flight, meals, and transportation in Washington. Honor flight just started up again after a two-year lapse due to Covid, and the price is up to about \$600 per veteran, all paid for by donations.

Being an open show, naturally, there were lots of muscle cars. There also were some street rods, military trucks, motorcycles, and some other just nice-looking cars. I was the only club member there, and there was only one other MG, an MGB from someone in Lebanon. He'd heard of us, but wasn't a club member. I didn't jot down his name, but I gave him an application. I hope everyone carries a few club applications in their car.

There was a different type of judging. There were no formal classes. But, there were at least four sponsors, and each got to pick about five or six of their favorites to receive a trophy. I got one from a local store called Vance Outdoors. Not being an outdoors type, I'll probably never patronize them, but urge others to do so.

Minutes from May Club Meeting
