The picnic is BYOB, so bring your own favorite beverage and a side dish or dessert to round out the barbecue and baked beans. Also, bring a lawn chair and spouse!

Here are the quickie directions in case your MG doesn't have a GPS. First of all, we're on the East side of I-75, as opposed to the Dayton Airport, which is on the west side of I-75. So, starting from I-75 and National Road, which is also Route 40, head East (British banners will mark where to turn as you follow your GPS from Exit 63 of Interstate-75). The most popular landmark will be Bunker's sports bar & grill, but more important to your driving is NOT to turn as Route 40 turns right at the traffic light, departing from National Road. Instead, stay straight ahead on National Road past the mega church and elementary school and turn at the first right, on Clubhouse Way, at signs to the city golf course. Then, take the first left turn onto Old Falls Drive. Then past the duplex houses on your left-hand side, turn left at a green molded mailbox with our address, 1991, the only blacktop drive in the development.

If you choose to stay on the back roads (Rt. 48 or County Road 25), turn East when you get to U.S. Route 40, National Road, continue past I-75, and then follow directions in the above paragraph. If that's all clear as mud, then just put the address in Waze and enjoy the round-about route it'll probably give you (I have no idea how it knows you're driving a vintage British sports car and thinks you are just out for a pleasant drive). If you get lost, call Cathy at (937) 206-5860 or Art at 206-5903.

Semiconductor Shortage is Chipping Away at Car Safety Features

ome automakers are deleting options for consumers amid today's chip shortage. Automakers struggling to build vehicles during the supply crisis of these essential components have had to remove a variety of electronic features from their vehicles to keep the assembly lines moving over the past two years. Everything from heated seats to fuel-saving cylinder-deactivation systems and touchscreen displays have been removed at times.

Safety features aren't immune from the cuts. Due in part to a scarcity of sensors, the availability of such optional features as blind spot monitoring systems, proximity alerts and semi-automated driver aids (ADAS) has also been suspended in some cases.

Volkswagen and Cadillac are among the brands currently not offering blind spot monitors and other

ADAS on some models — but the situation is constantly changing. The two automakers could not offer an outlook on availability at the time this story was published. "Automakers are in a tight spot when the materials aren't available for some of the safety technology," Jessica Cicchino, vice president of research for the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS), told FOX Business. "It really shifts the burden on the consumers who are already having a hard time shopping for a car," she also said.

Blind spot monitoring systems aren't mandated by any regulations, but they have become more common—and with good reason. An IIHS study found that the system can reduce injurious collisions by 23%, while the rear cross-traffic alert that's often bundled with it can cut backup crashes by 22%.

"While we don't test for them in our vehicle ratings programs, these are useful technologies to have, and we do want to see them on as many vehicles as possible," Cicchino also said. Since they're not required, these systems still aren't available at all on certain models, which makes it difficult to track exactly how many vehicles are being built without them. An automaker could simply shift toward manufacturing more of the low-spec models that don't have them without expressly "removing" the features.

"It's unfortunate that the chip shortage may prevent a new model from coming with the latest safety features that can prevent crashes and injuries," said Jake Fisher, senior director of automotive testing at Consumer Reports. "However, most automakers have the required chips to keep producing their models without removing equipment — and a smart shopper will avoid the models that do."

Automotive online marketplace Edmunds, advises car buyers to do their homework. "I think you can't rely on the salesperson to know every single thing that's on the car," said Ronald Montoya, Edmunds' senior consumer advice editor. "So I recommend looking at the window sticker because the feature will be deleted at the factory and noted — and that's probably the best way to go about it," he added.

With the average age of a car now over 12 years, it's not just an issue in today's tight buyer's market. "We will be seeing the consequences of the chip shortage for years to come," said Cicchino. "These vehicles are going to stay in the fleet now that people keep their cars for more than a decade. It'll mean that fewer of tomorrow's vehicles on the road will have this important technology," she also said.
