28 – Meeting (Bennett's Publical Family Sports Grill,) cars to Alaska, and Hawaii is even less likely. But there are several Canadian provinces and territories still on my list. Next year the NAMGAR GT will be near Mt Hood in Oregon, and my tentative plan is to drive up to Winnipeg and across to Banff before dropping down into Montana. That will get me three more provinces to add to my current four (BC, Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick). That just leaves Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island as the easy ones to add

to the list. At some point I would like to take the ferry to Newfoundland Island, but it's not something that will happen in 2024, and it may not happen when I first drive through NS and PE. I have an extensive spreadsheet with all the info on where I've been, and I have a map with where each of the cars has been. I keep adding to it every year. The info I have recorded along with the map also includes which car has been where. I can see the '70 has been to 45 states, DC and 4 Canadian Provinces, while the MGA has been to 39 states, DC and 2 provinces. GT-49 could add 4 provinces to the MGA in addition to adding 3 to my total. Depending on how I drive the MGA back from Oregon, I might even get a few more states for the MGA.

I went to Glacier National Park a few years ago on the way to NAMGAR GT-42, but I was too early for Glacier to be fully open (the "Going To The Sun" road is still covered by snow in June). Next year the GT is in July, so that should improve my odds of finding the park fully open. From there I may go on to the Grand Coulee Dam again to revisit where I lost a bearing on the layshaft of my transmission that led me to drive my MGA 1100 miles in fourth gear. Or I may avoid tempting fate and find a different path. Possibly down through northern Idaho, or maybe across central Idaho from Missoula, MT.

Regardless of how I get out to Oregon, I think I will not be returning in the car right after the event. I was thinking about shipping the car home and flying back

(although that would mean no new states this year for the MGA). I was also thinking about storing the car on the west coast and driving it back later in the year. I could take three weeks off together, but I prefer to spread my vacation out a bit more than that. Let me know if you have plans for GT-49 in Oregon next year. Maybe we can do some of the drive together.

Regarding the 48 states, the 48th was Oklahoma. GT-48 was in Memphis this year, but I still found a way to go through Oklahoma. My original plan was to go through Oklahoma last year on the way out to GT-47 in Colorado Springs. But I overheated the MGA in Louisville, and had to get it towed home. I ended up renting a car (I was out of conveniently located running MGs at that point!) to get to the GT that year. A couple friends were able to help me swap in a new engine last fall (2022) and I was able to drive it through the year since that point. I intended to leave that car in Virginia last winter, but the Yellow car had an axle problem shortly after I got it back on the road after an engine problem of its own. At some point I need to get the MGA painted, but I don't have space for all the cars in Ohio right now so doing prep for that job will need to wait.

To get through Oklahoma this year, I came up with a plan to drive out to Tucumcari, New Mexico prior to GT-48 and meet up with a friend from California. I'd been meaning to find an excuse to stay at one of the little motels in Tucumcari, and the best one is the Blue Swallow Motel. It still has rooms with attached garages. The two of us got adjacent rooms and kept the two MGAs in the single two car garage between the two rooms. The folks that own the motel are great, and they have a black lab named Marshall who is very friendly. If you find yourself in the area of Tucumcari I highly recommend you stop by and say hi to Marshall, and maybe even spend the night in one of the rooms at the Blue Swallow.

Other incidental things I was able to do along the way from Ohio to New Mexico and then back to Memphis included stopping for BBQ in Kansas City. I did that last year also, on the way to Colorado. Last year I ate at Joe's KC BBQ, which is on several lists for the best BBQ in Kansas. This year I stopped at Arthur Bryant's BBQ, which is on several lists for the best BBQ in Missouri. Two states worth of BBQ in one city. Both places are highly recommended, by me and by BBQ professionals. The burnt ends are better at Joe's, but the Rich & Spicy sauce at Arthur Bryant's is difficult to beat. I was looking forward to Memphis BBQ, but after bringing leftovers with me from Arthur Bryant's I only ate BBQ in Memphis once. I have had Charlie Vergos' Rendevous on my list for several years, so I guess I'll need to get back to Memphis at some point for more BBQ.

No shortage of places to go in the little British cars. See y'all at the meeting and Safety Fast.

Remembering Steve Markman

Ron Parks, Skip Peterson, Steve Powell and Ed Wolf

Ron Parks remembers Steve Markman as a good friend and longtime member of the MG Car Club Southwestern Ohio Centre. His contributions to the club in editing the newsletter over the years are much appreciated by the members who have enjoyed reading the newsletter each month. Those of us who contributed articles, President's column and minutes; will miss the friendly reminders from Steve, to send our input to beat the deadline. This would be followed by a "Not so friendly" reminder when we had not done so, as the deadline approached. We will miss receiving those emails from Steve! Although, as some of you have already seen, you will be receiving them from me, going forward here for a while?

Steve educated us with articles that explained in simple terms how automotive technologies have developed and evolved over the years to make our cars what they are today. These articles appeared in the monthly Octagon News, and some were republished in "THE MGDRIVER." Steve assembled these articles together along with a lot of other stuff to publish his book," The Long and Short (A science guy explains the development of automotive technology...and much more)

Steve had many hobbies that engaged his talents. He built model ships. He raised Koi fish. He was accomplished in Taekwondo. He held a commercial pilot license, although, not current. He reassembled and refurbished a player piano and had collected hundreds of music rolls. He played "The Entertainer" for us on his player piano, when Linda and I visited on the occasion of our club's last Pub Run, to "The Famous" restaurant, just down the street from his house. I treasure the ink pen he made of teak wood that uses Cross pen refills. He gave me this pen as an unexpected thank you gift for my helping him move into his new house. Last year Steve was honored for his volunteering may thousands of hours to the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force. Steve was a longtime Dayton Concours d'Elegance Class Host and sometimes entered his MG TD in the Concours.

Skip Peterson remembers that Steve was part of the Louie-Steve-John group that always parked in the same place at the Centerville Americana Festival Car Show, right under the trees by Marions. Steve enjoyed driving his Grandchildren in his MG, as he did in the 2018 Holiday at Home parade pictured herein.

Steve Powell remembers talking with Steve Markman at BCD & The Concours d'Elegance. Their MG-T-cars were always parked together, and they would discuss their next winter project plans for things to do to their cars. One time Steve Markman asked for a suggestion for improving his car to better his chances of winning awards at car shows. Steve Powell suggested a new top would be nice. So, the next season saw a new top on Steve Markman's TD. And, being the detail oriented engineer that Steve was, he had installed snaps to attach the top to the wooden back rail, in place of the original screws, making removal and stowage much easier. That year at the Concours, when it began to rain, they both put their tops up. Then, they asked the man next to them, if he needed help putting the top up on his award winning Austin Healey. When he admitted that he did not have a top on the car, they looked at each other and laughed! So much for the new top helping win an award?

Ed Wolf's Memories of Steve Markman:

Steve was a great friend and one of the first people I met when I moved to Dayton a little over 20 years ago. We met at the pre-school where his grandkids and my kids attended, and we were also both members of Temple Beth Or. Steve and Helen were very involved grandparents, and very friendly to those of us who had moved here from out of town. Several years later, when I joined the MG Car Club, I found that Steve was also a member, and was also the monthly newsletter editor. When I bought my MGB, Steve ran a story in the newsletter about my car.

Steve would invite me over to his house on occasion and he'd tour me around his basement workshop where numerous woodworking projects were always in flight. He also showed me various wooden sailing ship models which he painstakingly built by hand using tweezers and a magnifying glass. Those model ships are really, quite spectacular. He'd also show me his various indoor fish tanks and a fishpond he made in the backyard, complete with a waterfall and water filtration system. At one point, the fish in the pond were multiplying too quickly and Steve wanted to get some of the smaller ones out without needing to drain the water out first. We brainstormed several ideas, involving various approaches using nets and scooping out the smaller fish. Then we tried to apply these, the fish just proved to be too fast, and we couldn't catch any of them. So, I think Steve resolved to just drain the pond to get them concentrated into a smaller area and then pick them out using a net. Despite the failed attempt, Steve rewarded my efforts with a signed copy of his latest book, which I will now treasure as a reminder of him.
