He volunteered to come to my house and help ensure that my MG was road worthy for the trip to Niagara Falls, even though he was not going on the trip. I helped him install and bleed the brakes on his MGA, as you will read about in the Tech Tip article Skip wrote for this issue. Skip was a good contributor to this newsletter, always on the lookout for interesting subjects for us. You'll also read about the Lithuanian Social Club, the place where the club meetings were held back in the 90s, in an article Skip wrote for this issue.

When I joined the MG Car Club Southwestern Ohio Centre, in 1995, Skip Peterson was the president of the club. He was all about having fun with our MG s and each other. He included everyone, with no drama, and helped us all have good times. He led us on tours and my first out of town outing was to the British car show in Indianapolis at the military park. He led us back to Indianapolis in 1996 and had t-shirts made for our club to wear to the All-MG show, Indy '96'. He led us back to Indy again a couple of years later, when the show was at Raceway Park. He and Jennifer planned several other local tours for us over the years. Skip and I planned our caravan trips to French Lick, Indiana and Louisville, Kentucky. It has a Weber carb on it currently but I have the original SU's that it came with that were in a box in the trunk. My next project is to rebuild them and get them back on the car.



Tech Tips MGA Brake Shims

on Parks and I were putting the rear brakes on my MGA and we just couldn't get them adjusted. It has drums all around, the fronts adjusted fine. Ron gave Steve Powell a call and explained the situation. Steve knew the answer, the new shoes are a bit smaller and you need a shim in the adjuster. He had the same experience and he told Ron that he would make two and bring them to the next meeting. Sure enough, slide those shims in place and boom, those brakes are just fine. Below is from the MGAGuru site by Barney Gaylord. This is not the entire piece, just the first paragraph. Mine are not welded, just held in place by the shoe.

Going to do more brake work on the car today, determined to reduce the backlash in the brake adjusters. Something I have been resisting doing for at least 10 years, as we were trying to coerce the vendors into supplying correct length brake shoes. Unfortunately it hasn't been working, and likely never will, so now we get to show the world how to fix it. These shims are made from 1/8-inch thick steel plate, cut to 9/16" wide and 1-1/8" long, to be tack welded to the adjuster masks. Each front drum brake adjuster gets one shim, two adjusters per wheel, because there are two slave cylinders up front. Each rear drum brake adjuster gets two shims for 1/4-inch total thickness, one adjuster per wheel, because there is only one slave cylinder in back to move two shoes, and the one double thickness shim is working to space out two brake shoes.



US Life-Saving Service stations, coastal villages, and picturesque farmsteads reflect the park's rich maritime, agricultural, and recreational history.

The Old Mission Peninsula extends into Grand Traverse Bav from the middle of Traverse City. Historically, the peninsula was the home for many cherry orchards, thanks to the climate moderating effect of Lake Michigan and Grand Traverse Bay. In recent years, vineyards have expanded along with wineries. They provide scenic and tasty stops for visitors exploring the area. Several companies provide winery tours, allowing visitors to enjoy sampling the wines without worrying about driving. At the northern tip of the peninsula, Mission Point Lighthouse provides a destination for scenic photos. It is just one of the 129 lighthouses in Michigan.

Our host hotel will be the Great Wolf Lodge, just outside of Traverse City. The hotel has a full complement of amenities, plus an indoor waterpark, so bring your swim suit. Anyone who can extend their stay could finish any of the four selfdriving tours that the busy GT schedule didn't allow. Also, Mackinaw City is just three hours

Minutes from February Club Meeting

El Presidente Sam Hodges called the February 2025 meeting of the MGCC SWOC to order, for the fourth time for the third time precisely at 7:30. There were 24 in attendance. When subtracted from our beginning balance of \$1,262.31, leaves the MGCC with an ending balance of \$1,011.58. in the primary checking account. The savings account had \$4,383.60 before the application of \$0.19 in interest. The savings account now has \$4,383.79. Total ending balance of all accounts was \$5,485.37 with \$90.00 as cash on hand." Ron Parks motioned to approve the Treasurer's report. Eddie Hill seconded. MGCC voted. Treasurer's report approved. President Sam, "One of the requirements for the CD I'm still working on."

Membership Chairwoman Carole Looft was next. Carole, "We have 56 members so far. We have new members who are with us tonight." President Sam, "Speaking of which, let's let them introduce themselves." Chris and Jane own a red, early-1974 Midget. The one without the bumper overriders. Chris, "It's running now. It still has some problems but we love it."

Birthdays in February were: "Carol Estelle, Dan Mortensen, & Mark Schneider."

Activities with Eddie. Eddie Hill, "Don't know of anything new. Had a pub run at the Famous on Feb. 23rd that had a good turnout. April 26th is the Tune-Up Clinic. Just a reminder that you need to get home ASAP after the Crystal Lake, Illinois show. BCD is that next Saturday. There's a meet for three clubs up in Celina, Friday, May 9."
