# Mark Schneider's "MG TD"

W

hen I was in first grade class back in 1968, I put together a book (that I still have) of what I would be like when I grew up. On one of the pages, I noted that I'd have an "Old Day's Car" with a picture of a 1920's style automobile. I had admired the Rolls Royce and Duesenberg cars of the 1920's, building models of the like.

In 1987, my girlfriend ran across an ad with an MG TD convertible for sale. She was expecting to see a car like an MG-B, but when we went to look at it - there it was – a black 1953 MG-TD. It was the first one that I'd ever seen in person. I wanted it!

I bought the car from Jim Corbitt in Kettering. (See Photo at right) He was the second owner. He had done a restoration of it – believe that he said it was in 1967 soon after he bought it. Fortunately, I'd driven an Opel in college with a stick, so I was able to drive it home fairly smoothly.

I joined the MG Car Club soon after. I remember attending my first tune-up clinic, where Steve Miller did a tune-up on my new prize. One Year, I joined some of the other members of the MG Car Club with taking the Holiday at Home Queen and her court for rides to the court entrance. The Queen rode in my MG TD.

There came a time when the MG-TD sat for too long and I couldn't get it started. I Took it over to a friend's house to work with him to get it running but we never seemed to have time. I decided to haul it to MG Automotive, where Steve Miller got it running again around 2016. I rejoined MG Car Club Southwestern Ohio Centre.

I ran into Jim Corbitt's son about four years ago. His family was having a picnic in Bellbrook near my house, so I stopped by with the MG-TD. They had fond memories of it with their Dad. Jim's sister recalled driving it a good bit – believe that she learned to drive in it.



I was a member of the MG Car Club from around 1988 to around 1993 - for about 4-5 years, then got busy with family and kids. The British Car Day was an annual event for the MG back then.

Around 1990, my wife (Anna) and I bought a green 1977 MG-B which we had for around four years. Once we had kids, we didn't drive it much and with it being a two-seater, we couldn't take the little ones with us, so we sold it to make room in the garage.



e attempted to depart on Sunday but had to overcome a dead battery caused by leaving the ignition on overnight, says Dave Gribler. We were on our way after 20 minutes on the charger and arrived at the Ft Meigs car show around 9:20AM. The five MGAs on the show field included ourselves and Dave & Kim Smittle in their stunning Iris Blue MGA Coupe and Maya Shoviak with their OWE MGA. Ron Parks was observed on the show field a bit later in his MGB roadster. The Shoviak's red MGC GT was also on display. I managed to recruit one of the MGA owners as a new NAMGAR meeting

during the day. We spent a pleasant day talking to other British car owners and in particular checking out the E-Type Jaguars on the show field. Our MGA won an award of excellence in the MGA class with the

Smittles winning the class. Ron came home with a first place award in his MGB category. After the show we visited the Ft. Meigs museum and fort on the property and learned a little history of the area and the War of 1812. After checking into the hotel and freshening up a bit we met Tony & Janet Shoviak for dinner.

Departing Perrysburg Monday morning, we completed the trip north to the Great Wolf Lodge in Traverse City. Looft and Planeaux contingents had already arrived so we found a parking spot adjacent to their After checking in, unloading the car and visiting GT registration we settled in to visiting with many of our old NAMGAR friends and began making acquaintance with some new ones. There was a First Timers Reception late afternoon

followed by a general Welcome and Orientation meeting with all attendees. The evening wrapped with a well-hosted Hospitality Suite.

Tuesday was a Magnette owners' breakfast event and John Twist rolling tech. Terry ran both Carol's car and his coupe through the tech and discovered that all was pretty much as it should be. We headed out on the scenic self-drive tour to the lighthouse on the Old Mission Peninsula, which was also the same route as the gimmick rally. The questions were easy and the route was simple so I'm certain the mileage tie breaker ended up









deciding the winner. I attended a NAMGAR Board meeting in the afternoon, while Lois enjoyed the first of three afternoon teas held in the hospitality room. I did a quick car wash to prepare for Wednesday morning car show before departing for an off-site pig roast dinner. Weather was kicking up with the threat of storms and some wind during dinner. We learned that this caused a massive tree to fall on the show field grounds while the set-up crew was working to lay out the field.

It began to rain around midnight and did not let up until around 10AM on Wednesday. We

received a notice that the start of the show was being delayed until noon and being cut short by an hour so the afternoon events could proceed on schedule. After parking on the show field and doing a bit of last minute polishing we set off to cast our ballot for each of the car classes. This process usually takes every bit of a three hour car show as we are continually distracted with visits with old friends, but we finally managed to complete the task within the allotted time. Our MGA was in the Premier class as we won the MGA MKII class in Oregon last year, thus we were forced to compete with Terry's coupe and four other Premier cars (class winners compete in Premier for three years). One rusted hulk named Pickle was trailered from West Virginia to be displayed (so sad!). Pickle was in attendance at NAMGAR's first GT in 1975.

Following the show we returned to the hotel and briefly stopped by the afternoon tea and visited the vendor area in the ballroom. At this point we intended to head out on another self-drive tour to the Grand Traverse Lighthouse on Grand Traverse Bay. We were slightly delayed by an encounter in the parking lot with our friends Moose and Greg from Texas. They were trying to get underway for a drive to the "Tunnel of Trees", a scenic section of highway north of Traverse City on the west coast of Michigan's Lower Peninsula. Moose's car responded positively to the loaner distributor from the stash of spare items in my trunk. After sending the Texans on their way, we headed off on our own adventure, returning to the hotel in time for the Wednesday evening hospitality room activity.



We attended the Thursday morning NAMGAR Board & Staff breakfast and then toured through the hotel public areas to see what we might be missing (not much – lots of families with kids). After placing a few last-

minute bids on silent auction items we then attended the afternoon NAMGAR Chapter Contacts meeting to discuss NAMGAR support of and communication with local clubs such as ours.



During the Thursday evening awards banquet, four members who had attended NAMGAR's first GT in 1975 were recognized, with two being in attendance and the other two having registered, but forced to cancel at the last minute because of health issues. After celebrating NAMGAR's 50th anniversary and the 70th anniversary of the MGA with cake and a champagne toast, the remainder of the awards continued as usual. Dar & Mary Planeaus's car won 3rd in the MGA 1500 wire wheel class and Ryan Looft won 3rd in the Magnette class. Terry Looft won the Premier class with his

MGA Coupe and is now relegated to the Premier Emeritus class (along with Carole Looft's roadster). Because of all of the added festivities, the banquet ultimately consumed an extra hour and the hospitality suite time was reduced by an hour, ending promptly at the scheduled time of 11PM.

We took our good old time Friday morning and, after some creative packing and many good-byes, managed to get underway before 10am. We decided visit Muncie Imports since there was no real time or distance penalty in detouring home via Muncie, Indiana. The Jaguar had been picked up by the shop the Friday before, for new top and interior installation and we wanted to visit the shop anyway. It was late Friday afternoon so work had pretty much wound down for the day by the time we arrive. We were able to meet a few of the guys who will be working on our car.

In all a good event and well attended. There were over 120 cars on the show field and over 200 participants. This was the fifth GT hosted by the Michigan Rowdies MGA club, the previous ones being GT-10 (Plymouth, MI), GT-20 (Lansing, MI), GT-30 (Mackinaw, MI) and GT-40 (Frankenmuth). I will add that we continue to receive high praise from attendees for our event, GT-37 in 2012. (I'm NOT suggesting we volunteer to do another!)

Next year's GT will be part of the 5 year "All MG Meet" to be held at Kalahari Resort in Sandusky in late August, also to be designated as MG International 2026. This destination is located a mere 3 hours from Dayton, accessible via a pleasant, lightly traveled drive north in OH State Route 4. It would appear that this is an opportunity for an organized SWOCMGCC event to attend. It was also announced that GT-52 will be held in May, 2027 at the French Lick Springs Resort in French Lick, Indiana.


