The Club (as I will refer to it) was formed in 1966, August or September, with the first meetings at Davis Buick (Dayton's lone MG dealer at that time). We met in the Show Room on folding chairs. For those of you who have no idea where Davis Buick was, it was located on South Main Street in the complex of buildings now housing the Blood Bank and the Packard Museum. The Parts Department was located in the exact place where the Packard Museum now resides. I have attached a list of Club Officers from the Club beginning to the present and while I feel it is reasonably accurate, there is always some level of error.

Club Membership Information

Membership dues of the Southwestern Ohio Centre of the MG Car Club are eighteen (\$18.00) per year, payable during September and October. On January 1st. the names of delinquent members are removed from the roster. See Jennifer Peterson for further membership information.

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At the time of Club formation the MG automobiles were manufactured by British Motor Corporation (BMC), later to become British Leyland when BMC and Triumph combined. The area representative for BMC at the time of Club formation was a man named Jim Deppner. Jim got a list of all registered MG cars in the area and sent out flyers inviting owners to an organizational meeting for a MG Club. Jim was very active in the Club formation and early events until he had a falling out with BMC. From the first meetings at Davis Buick, we moved to the lower level of the "Landmark Cafeteria" located where Frickers South is now. We held monthly meetings and began work on the original Club Constitution and Rally Rules. Dixon Switzer, our first President was a stickler for "Robert's Rules of Order" and meetings became long and full of discussion, but we prevailed finished and the documents which have guided us through the years. It is at this time that we applied for affiliation with the International Club and took our official name. (See attached reproduction of announcement in News Paper).

The Club was Incorporated under the laws of the State of Ohio on October 13, 1968. I still remain the Statuary Agent representing the Club in Corporation documents which are updated every 5 years.

Meetings were moved over the years to numerous locations such as Vic Cassano's on Stroop Road, Urban Suburban, Pappy's Kitchen on North Main Street, Kettering Village Inn (where we were constantly interrupted by beer bottles being sent down a chute),

According to Club President, Dixon Switzer, the Club will now be known as The MG Car Club Southwestern Ohio Centre.

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Organized in May, 1966, the Dayton club was founded by a number of owners of the English cars who were interested in becoming part of the International Club. The Southwestern Ohio Centre becomes the twentythird such Centre in the United States and one of fifty-seven throughout the world, including such locations as Australia. Rhodesia, Holland, France, Switzerland. Sweden. Japan, India, and Canada.

The local club has been active in sponsoring area sports car rallies and plans to expand activities with gymkahans, scenic tours and other motoring and social events.

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The financial aspect is very positive, with a net profit of about \$2600. It was decided to leave the \$1000 seed money in the checking account and divide the remaining amount, roughly \$800 per club. Excellent weather and car count, brisk concession sales and sponsor support, in addition to no rental fee for the site were all factors in the financial success of the event. A deadline of Sept. 22 was agreed upon for a complete financial accounting of the event to be delivered to both clubs. Ron Wynne said the Five Rivers Metro Parks were pleased and have offered a 5 year agreement. Wynne was asked to proceed to get the five year agreement in writing. There is no real penalty should we decide to break the contract, but it does guarantee the first Saturday in August as the date for the next five years. There was a lot of positive feedback from the attendees about the site so it appears we have a winner in the location.

Talk then turned to the actual organization of the event, and it was agreed upon that there should be one person to serve as the General Chairman of the event. That chairman would report to the president's of both clubs, but would have the overall responsibility to appoint the needed committee heads and make sure everything happens successfully. It was also agreed upon that there should be estimated budgets for the various committees based upon the financial records of the past few years.

With both of those items agreed upon, Frank Ciboch and Skip Peterson were both nominated as potential General Chairmen. Ciboch declined the nomination and Peterson was named general chairman by either acclamation or default, depending on how you look at it.

The date for next year is Saturday, August 2 (pending approval of the Park people)., There was also discussion to drop the word Cycles from the name of the event and refer to it as BCD '97(still open to discussion.)

There is a serious need for volunteers to head committees, and we would like to appoint those as soon as possible. Chairs are needed for registration, vendors,



awards, the site, 1-shirts, public relations, food and door prizes. While we have many experienced people who have handled these jobs before, we would still like to hear from anyone interested in being a committee chair. The responsibility for each of these committees will be outlined in writing at the next BCD meeting.

Anyone interested in either chairing a committee or just volunteering is encouraged to attend the next meeting. It is scheduled for 7:30 PM, Oct. 22 at Marion's Piazza at the corner of Patterson Rd and Shroyer near the Dayton/Oakwood city line. Collector & Historical Plates

his information was Faxed to me by the License bureau and appears on the back of the applications for these special plates.

"Collector's Vehicle" means any motor vehicle or agricultural tractor or traction engine of special interest having a fair market value of one hundred dollars or more, whether operable or not, that is owned, operated, collected, preserved, restored, maintained or used essentially as a collector's item, leisure pursuit or investment, but not as the owner's principal means of transportation. "Licensed collector's vehicle" means a collector's vehicle, other than an agricultural tractor or traction engine, that displays current, valid license tags issued under Section 4508.45 of the Ohio Revised Code (O.R.C.), or a similar type of motor vehicle that displays current, valid license tags issued under substantially equivalent provision in the laws of other states (O.R.C. 4501.01). \$5.00 plus \$2.25 deputy fee. Replacement plates cost \$5.00.

You may purchase Collector's plates by mail by sending the amount due, make checks payable to State of Ohio BMV; your current registration card for the vehicle and completed signed application. A temporary registration or registration card which expired



Collector's License plates must be renewed annually for a cost of

more than 11 months ago is an unacceptable substitute for a current registration card. If current

registration card is unavailable, send Certificate of Title or Memorandum Title (original document only). You may take these documents to any deputy registrar agency. The deputy will verify the vehicle information for a service fee.

Mail your application and related information to: Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Attn: Registration Division, P.O. Box 16521, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0021. Your application will be processed and plates will be mailed within four weeks. Failure to follow instructions will delay the processing of your application.

If your current registration expires within 90 days, your application will be held so that new license plates can be issued during your month of registration.

Now for **Historical** plates. To qualify, motor vehicles must be at least 25 years old. They are solely collector's items and are used for participation in club activities, exhibitions, tours, parades, etc, but NOT for general transportation.

Historical license plates are valid without renewal for the life of the vehicle, except when there is a change in ownership. In that case, the plates must be surrendered to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles.

If the vehicle has a regular Ohio vehicle registration, there will be no refund or partial refund for your current vehicle registration.

As for **Historical "Model Year"** plates, no fees are required. The model year license plates shall be authentic, legible and serviceable license plate by the State of Ohio and the same year as the vehicle. Historical military vehicles may

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display the assigned registration number of the vehicle by painting the number on the front and rear of the vehicle. Only one model-year plate is required to be displayed on the rear of the historical motor vehicle at all times. To comply with O.R.C. 4503.19 (requires distinctive number plate be issued to a motor vehicle) the vehicle must be registered with regular Ohio historical plates. The model year plate must be procured by the applicant. The model year registration card, the distinctive historical plates and registration card must be in the vehicle and available upon demand by law enforcement officer at all times the vehicle is operated.
