




held on Sunday September 19, 2004 at the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery in Dayton Ohio (see photos).



It should also be recognized that many of the class marshals give up part of Saturday before the event



to help Eddie layout the show field, stuff goodies bags, pickup sticks and trash, run errands, and literally do anything they are asked.

# Steve's Carburators... An Update...And the Adventure Continues

First the good news. I'm reasonably sure my sticky carb problem is solved. After the driving season ended, my first project was to paint the valve cover, right side of the engine, and the exhaust manifold. The paint job would be easier by removing the carbs, still attached to the intake manifold. Once they were off the car, I took this assembly back to MG Automotive and Steve Miller worked on them a little more. He said that all he did was open the carbs, then retighten everything, but he got the jets to retract fully and smoothly without binding (Recall that after driving a mile, I used to stop, pop open the bonnet, and manually retract the jets to the full lean position).

I got everything back together within a few days, fired it up, and drove through the neighborhood for ten minutes or so to make sure everything was working. I pushed the choke to the panel, and the carbs did indeed go to lean. Then, out on the country roads for a good run.

It ran great for another few miles until the engine just died. Dead. Nothing. I spotted a patch of gravel off the side of the road ahead and coasted to it. After stopping, I pulled the starter knob. The engine turned over but not a hint of a sputter. I lifted the bonnet and turned the ignition back on. No ticking from the fuel pump. I opened one of the carb bowls, and it was empty. (Say what you like about antique cars, but most problems sure are easy to troubleshoot!) I took the cap off of the fuel pump and tried my



best to clean the points, to no avail.

About this time, someone came by and stopped. He didn't have a cell phone, but offered to drive me into Bellbrook, about a mile away. I hated leaving the TD by the road, but didn't have much choice. I called a tow truck and the good samaritan drove me turned back. He out to be a fireman/paramedic, and even insisted on buying me a cup of coffee so that I wouldn't be cold sitting in the car waiting. As if things weren't bad enough, the only other driver to stopped turned out to be my old friend and former co-worker, Bruce Clough, who also happens to be the president of the Triumph club! We've traded many jabs over the years. I had no idea he lived nearby, and he just happened to be off work that day. Since the truck was on its way, I told him I really didn't need any more help. The flat bed truck arrived shortly and we got the TD home safely. I don't think any of the



neighbors saw our undignified return. AAA paid the tow, so at least I felt a little less bad.

Safely in the garage, I took a closer look at the pump. The points appeared to be in good shape. When I applied power, I noticed that the pump made one click, then stopped. Could the points be sticking? I tried a few dabs of oil on the pins, but no improvement. Could the inlet filter be clogged? I disconnected the fuel line from the tank, but the pump still gave only one tick when I applied power. The only other thing I could think of was the capacitor. Since it is there only to keep a spark from jumping over the points, I reasoned that the pump should work without it, but to expect to see a spark. Wrong again...still just one tick and a big spark over the points. At this point I was out of ideas. I contacted Dave DuBois in Bremerton, Washington, who overhauls SU fuel pumps, and sent it to him for repair.
