My tech tip for November:

Masking tape is great for painting, but there are a few other tricks that can keep items from getting overspray. If you're doing touch up's under the hood, aluminum foil can be used to wrap tightly around parts and deflect over spray. And when using masking tape, using a very sharp X-Acto knife to cut the



tape perfectly is required. But, my favorite discovery is petroleum jelly or Vaseline. Depending on the size of the parts, you can use your finger to smear the jelly over anything that you don't want painted. For tight detail work, use a Q-tip, and lightly coat the Q-tip with petroleum jelly, then smooth a




fine coating of it around the edges, etc. Make sure you cover everything that you don't want paint on. Then paint away... When the part is completely dry, just wipe off the petroleum jelly. There won't be any paint on the area that you covered with petroleum jelly.






Rome, Italy, while on leave from duty in Germany, December 1945

Near Heidelberg, Germany, with a new friend that preferred GIs over Germans, shortly after the end of WWII




