really just continue running up the bill without getting the car done, and when it is done, charges you twice what the car would ever be worth. Talk about making the car hobby not fun!

So, my ramblings about restoring- I did the MGB 15 years ago, like most any first time MG owner, mostly backwards. It was a black, dented, barely running car, but I thought the price was right. After 6 months of mechanical work, nothing real major but getting everything in order, I wanted the car painted. That's when I learned just how much bondo was in it.

I was lucky to use a local shop, which is owned by a guy who knows how important word of mouth is. Yes, he's in business to make money, but he wants to stay in business for many years. He treated me fairly, made no excuses, and called each time another chunk of bondo fell on the floor. He stopped calling when the trunk floor collapsed-just kidding.

That said, I had sunk quite a few bucks into the bright red B. It looked great, and I'm glad I did what I wanted, cause it's my car. Over the years, I've re-done pieces here and there, yanked the engine to re-do the engine bay and have a peek inside (nothing major needed, I was lucky!), installed a new interior, new top, etc. Bottom line- I have a lot more invested in that car than I'll ever get for selling it. I also discovered that my shop fee at home is great, \$0.00 per hour. But if it were say \$50-\$70 per hour, well, then the MGB would be a \$50,000 car.

So what's my point? Well, I'm not sure, but how about this. Watch out where you have big ticket work done, because you can easily get ripped off. And if you can, do the work yourself. We restore, or work on our MG's because we really like them. We want to drive them, keep them in good shape, and prove the Miata drivers wrong; a well maintained MG is just as reliable as any other car on the road.

Afraid? Don't be, there are tons of manuals and books, and we have a wealth of knowledge and talent in this group. Don't be afraid to call someone. Most everyone in this club will share advice or point you to the one who knows even more; some even show up at your house!

And you can paint it any color you want, or add tube shocks, chrome valve covers and a supercharger, whatever you chose to make it the way you want it. Because after all, it's YOUR MG!

And the red B isn't for sale, ever. It was my first one, and I'm keeping it!

This entire column also serves as my tech tip for the month. Take on something you think you can't do. I'll bet that you can do it. It might take longer, it might have to be done more than once, you might put it together and take it apart three times or more, but in the end, you'll complete it. It might not be pretty along the way, but when it's done, you'll be smiling. Again, it's YOUR MG.

Tech Tips

Then tightening "knockoffs" on your wire wheels, mark the knockoffs and the hubs in a straight line (alignment mark) with a wax crayon. Check them after driving a short distance. If the marks are no longer aligned, the wheel is coming loose. This usually happens if the splines are worn,. Then, you can wipe off the crayon mark.

Replacement fan belts can be obtained easily and cheaply at your local heating and cooling shop. They carry the wider belts we use on our MGs, as opposed to your local auto parts store, which usually has only the modern, narrow belts.

To overcome or eliminate most of the Lucas electrical problems, polish every one of the electrical connectors (male/female) with some fine paper, all the round "washer-type" leads, fuses, ammeter connectors (under the dash), voltage regulator connections, and light connections (including under the dash and under the fenders). As you do each one, apply a light coating of di-electrical silicone grease and you can forget corrosion and be assured of a good electrical connection with minimum resistance. This also applies to the generator connections and both ends of the battery cables. Your lights won't flicker. Put this on your spark plugs leads, also.

If your gas tank is slopping over when full, simply drop a sink drain pipe (cut to desired length) down into the fill opening. It fits below the filler cap and will not fall into the tank because it has a lip or flange on it.

When installing "finder welt" or "squeak strips," put duct tape on the bottom edge, all the way up to the "roll". Put a little bit of rubber or upholstery glue on either part of the sheet. Better on the body joint or stationary part. Leave enough length of the duct tape to hang down so you can get a grip on it, every six or eight inches apart along the fender welt. Put your fender welt in place, cutting or "notching" it for the bolt holes to pass through. Put your sheet metal part in place while this fender welt is in approximate position. Run your bolts in, but do not tighten them. Pull down firmly on the duct tape tabs as you snug up the bolts even The fender welt will pull down and should then be flush. When it is, tighten the bolts as you work your way along. Then, when you are satisfied the fender welt is snug and where you want it and the mounting bolts are tight, tear off the duct tape tat is hanging down. It will tear off flush and you'll never see it.

If your fender welt is wrinkling over sharp

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curves, use a hair dryer or heat gun (carefully) and your wrinkles will pull out and disappear. DO NOT TRY THIS ON YOUR FACE OR OTHER WRINKLES!!

If your gas tank sending unit is "weeping" or leaking, coat both sides of the gasket with the silicone gasket sealer and the bolt or screw heads, both sides of the washers, and the screw threads. This should stop it.

Add water pump lubricant and rust inhibitor to your radiator. It's well worth it to preserve your cooling system and pump. Auto parts stores, Wal-Mart, etc, carry this.

If you have a brake master cylinder from Moss Motors or anywhere else and the filler cap (by Girling) has plastic threads which strip easily, Moss does not carry the replacement cap any more and they are impossible to find. The threads measure approx 1 ½ inches in diameter (much larger than the original filler caps). Go to your local hardware store and purchase a "mechanical test plug." Drill vent holes in the top and bottom of the tapered "squeeze washers" (same diameter holes as the original cap). The test plug will fit into the top of your master cylinder and when you tighten the wing nut of the threaded bolt, the tapered washers will squeeze the rubber washer against the threads and your master cylinder will not leak. The test plug is impervious to brake fluid. They also are available in smaller sizes.

If you have a rear window on a roadster that is scratched and cloudy, you can make it clear again by using "Rainex" which is a silicone solution. You can get the stuff at any parts house or Wal Mart, Meijer, etc. where they sell oil and car stuff. Just follow the directions and you will be amazed at the results. I put it on mine 3 or 4 years ago and it's STILL clear as a bell. You can also put it on the glass windsheild if it is pitted and get the same results. I'm sure everyone knows that if you have a canvas top, leave it up all the time unless you are driving with it down. That way it doesn't absorb any moisture (humidity, etc) and doesn't shrink. If you do leave it down and later try to put it up, it is a "bear" to try to pull it in place and snap. When it's up, it also helps dry the top and prevent any musty/mildew smell.

...bet you didn't realize how easy it is to keep your MG in top shape!

Quietly, the price of good entry-level collectible British sports cars has risen dramatically. When it comes to the price of admission into the British Sports Car Club, it will take \$25,000 to buy what \$15,000 would have two years ago.

Think of the collector car market as a giant wheel. When certain cars rotate up-market, like the perfect Austin-Healeys that are bringing nearly \$100,000 at auction, lesser cars are pulled up as well. In short, if you've ever been inclined to have an English roadster leaving its oily greeting on your garage floor, now is the time to write the check.

Two of the most popular British cars are the nimble, attractive MGA and the bulldog tough TR3. Here are two examples, from the *Sports Car Market* magazine database (www.sportscarmarket.com), showing current market values – Keith Martin


