Member Featured Car of the Month: Dar and Mary Planeaux's 1958 MGA

Reporters note: I am reviving this monthly column which appeared in newsletters past to: first - provide interesting reading in the newsletter, and second - to build an archive of information and photos about members' cars for the club website. Ron Parks

In November 1960, I was assigned to Wright Patterson AFB as a Lieutenant in the Air Force. I worked for the Air Force in the military and then as a civilian for a total of 42 years, retiring in 2003. I bought my 1958 MGA in 1964 for \$595.00. I planned to use it as a second car but it became my everyday driver for the next 8 years. It came

a complete restoration, but as I took it apart, it became obvious that if it was going to be restored to original condition, then every nut and bolt would have to be disassembled. I guess my philosophy was to use the 3 R's in the restoration: Repaint, Replate, or Replace. The effort was completed almost two years later, in July 2003. Steve Miller of MG Automotive accomplished the mechanical work and Tom Dworetsky of Superior Finishes did the paint and body work . The first owner had repainted the MG from its original black to green, but the original factory interior was green. In the restoration we

with six wire wheels, so I mounted snow tires on two of them for winter driving. With the help of a 100 pound bag of rock salt in the boot, I drove the MGA through every type of weather. My oldest son and my daughter both learned to drive in the MGA because it had a standard transmission. When we built a new home in 1973, the MG was put in one of the garage bays, covered, and not driven much after that. By 1978, the storage became permanent, remaining there for 23 years until October 2001, when we began the restoration project. It didn't start out as

retuned the exterior color to the original black but changed the interior to biscuit tan leather. Working for the Air Force, those 23 years slipped by fast, especially with so much travel keeping me away from home so often. My one regret was not starting the restoration sooner, because the MGA has been a delight to drive since completing the restoration.

Addendum to previous article on maximizing your gas mileage.

Previously I covered the great mileage you can get on a trip by refilling your gas tank as soon as the gauge leaves the full mark or soon there after. Now with all the Christmas shopping and in-town driving as of late, I have come to realize that this holds true while in town driving just as well as it does for highway use. I have seen that when the tank is full, I can go for two or three days and the gauge never left the full mark, what a pleasure. Then I taxed my engineering and automotive background to come up with a plausible explanation for this wonderful gift. Here it is... cars for many years have had fuel vapor recovery systems. Think about it!! When your tank is full, there are more vapors and when they are recovered and reused, voila, your gas mileage is improved. As the fuel in your tank goes lower, the amount of vapors are reduced and the primary source for fuel in the engine is more directly from the tank, a rate that increases very rapidly as the fuel gauge goes down. This is proven when the gauge reaches ¹/₄ tank or less. From there you best be looking very quickly for a gas station as the amount of vapor left in the tank is very small. Now you know, so keep an eye on that fuel gauge!!
