From the MG Bulletin Board

... the question:

On start up from cold the tappets on my 51 TD clatter away for about a minute or so until the oil reaches the top end and quiets things down to normal. Oil pressure is a pretty good constant 50psi dropping to about half that on idle. So far so good except the tappets still rattle!! Your thoughts will be very much appreciated. ...the replies:

My car does this as well and always has since I have owned it. I thought that it was pretty normal and have never worried about it. It just takes a little time for the oil to get up there and down the push rods to the cam followers. Hope I'm right.

I would suspect worn rocker shaft bushings along with a worn shaft. This will lower the oil pressure reading considerably. FYI. MG's do not leak oil, they just mark their territory. I never start my TD until I have cranked the engine with the key off. I pull on the starter cable until I have a oil pressure reading on the gauge. Then, I turn key to "on," let the carbs fill and start the engine. This always gets oil to the upper engine and tappets. My rocker arm tappets also are a little loud until the engine warms up. I've always thought of this in a MG engine as music. MG's just sound different than Ford V8's or Chevy's Hope this helps.

All engines with solid valve lifters clatter on startup because the cold valve clearance is greater that the hot clearance by several thousandths of an inch. So they always "tap" a little when cold. As soon as the engine heats up and the valves expand longitudinally the "taps" should mostly go away. Oil has very little to do with the tappet noise. (unless you don't have any).
